Cultural diversity and Maori Dimension at Glenview School

We will reflect New Zealand's cultural diversity by:

Providing equal opportunities for all students

Through our inquiry learning topics students will have the opportunity to learn about themselves and their culture and heritage and the culture and heritage of other students. These programmes will recognise the multicultural society in which we now live.

The unique position of the Maori by :

With a third of our role Maori it is essential that this is reflected in the life of the school. The continuation of a whanau group will help support the school with an understanding that 'what works for Maori students, works for all students'

We will incorporate Tikanga Maori into the school's curriculum by:

Incorporating a Tikanga Maori programme as an integral part of the curriculum, providing powhiri for special occasions, marae study, waiata and kapa haka programmes and celebrating significant Maori occasions (matariki).

As the relationship between the Whanau group and school develops it is anticipated further assistance will be provided to enhance the quality of tikanga maori programmes in the school.

Integrating Te reo Maori as part of the curriculum areas in an appropriate manner.

We will provide instruction in te reo Maori for fulltime students whose parents request it by:

Directing Parents who require full instruction in Maori to close neighbouring schools who offer bi-lingual or total immersion programmes.

(At present all our classes are mainstream and presently we have no staff who could run an immersion programme)

To discover the views and concerns of the school's Maori community we will:

Consult with the school Whanau group through our BOT liaison member so we are aware of the views and concerns of the Maori community. We will also consult with Maori families through our annual survey aggregating their data separately. The Principal will report the aggregation of Maori achievement data to the BOT separately where appropriate.
