Welcome parents / caregivers to Week 6 at Glenview this term!

This week year 3-6 children are taking part in student led conferences. It is good to hear the positive feed back from both teachers and parents on how well the children can talk about their learning and what they need to work on next. If for some reason you were not able to make an appointment or missed your appointment please contact us at school and we will try and accommodate you.

This Friday we are having an open afternoon for parents of Yr 1/2 children. You are welcome to come and see your child in action in the class and share their learning.

The Yr 1/2 children will bring their portfolios home on Friday afternoon.

Yesterday our cross country team took part in the interschool cross country held at Resthills Park. With the good running conditions and the training done at school our children excelled. Over all, our children ran intelligently placing in the front half of the fields and many taking the top 6 places. The results appear later in the newsletter.

Last night we were visited by an unknown group whom thought it would be funny to vandalise the swimming pool. To help save time and money it was decided to leave the pool full over winter. Classroom Refurbishment.

The Ministry have given us the final okay to start the refurbishment of rooms 7,8 and 9 and the construction of a new toilet block. This Friday the children in rooms 8 and 9 will move to rooms 6 and 12 while the work on their classes is completed. We are doing all we can to make sure the children's learning is not inconvenienced in any way.

Education Announcements.

Following on from last weeks Government announcements related to class sizes, performance pay and improving the quality of teachers, it is interesting to note that the Government have now changed their minds relating to technology teachers at Intermediate schools. It is concerning when announcements that are supposed to be for the betterment of children's education can be changed so quickly.

The government have not changed the ratios for year Yr 2-6 children.

As mentioned last week evidence shows that the most disadvantaged children in larger classes are those children with the highest needs and the early years are the best time to address those needs. It may also mean schools drop withdrawal or extra programmes run by trained teachers. In our case this could be Reading Recovery, Literacy unit or extra curricula programmes like Tikanga Maori or music. As I mentioned last week let your local MP know your concerns.
