Engagement Tip (Being supported in their Learning)

This week we held the Student Led Conferences. Again this is an example of how parents can play an important part in assisting children to be engaged in their learning. The opportunity for children to talk about their learning with adults who play an important part in their lives is invaluable. It reaffirms the importance of learning in a positive way and the importance of having whanau who show an interest in what their children are doing at school.

Illnesses/stomach flu:

We have had several children at school becoming unwell with stomach bugs over the past few weeks. A reminder to ensure that children are washing their hands after using the toilet and prior to eating. We also request that if your child is presenting with symptoms of a stomach bug such as a sore stomach, vomiting or diarrhoea, that you keep them home and do not return them to school until 24 hours after they are free of symptoms.

This is open to all ages and you don't have to be enrolled in our gym to come along!

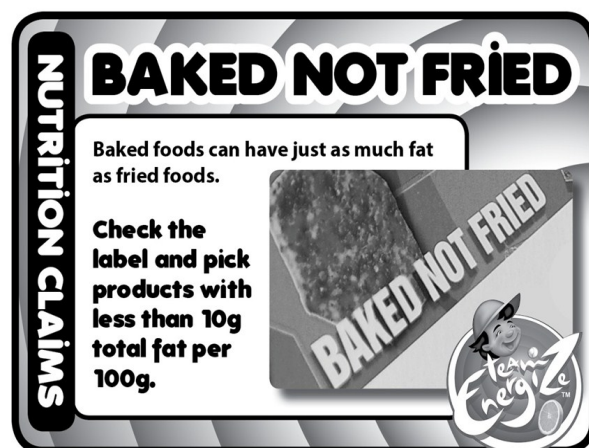
